- Additionally, Ursula was romantically involved with the original rebel, “East of Eden” star James Dean
- Ursula’s admirers also included the world famous composer and pianist Burt Bacharach, who created as a tribute to Ursula, his most famous song “The Look of Love”



- However it was in 1962 that Ursula was immortalized in Hollywood history with her smoldering-yet-alooof screen presence as “Honey Ryder” in the James Bond film “Dr. No” with Sean Connery



- ‘That scene’ of her emerging from the sea, immediately established Ursula as one of the most desired women in the world, helped to start the James Bond legend that continues to this day, and set the Bond Girl standard beside which all future Bond actresses would be judged
